<ul> <li>Name more than five pictures in books?</li> </ul>		
• Use size words, some prepositions? (e.g. "out," "off," "under")		
<ul> <li>Use two or three-word phrases to talk about and ask for things?</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Produce the following sounds clearly at the beginning of words?</li> </ul>		
(p, b, m, k, g, w, h, n, t, d)		
<ul> <li>Produce the following sounds clearly at the end of words: b, p, m, n</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Speech is understood by familiar listeners most of the time?</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Often ask for or direct attention to objects by naming them?</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Stair climbing matures-use one foot per step, first with support &amp; then without?</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Walk forward or backwards on a balance beam?</li> </ul>		
• Running matures; better able to stop quickly, avoid obstacles & make sharp turns?
